### **Stepney Words**

#### - SJCR students participate in filming for BBC's The One Show

n May 2017 Sir John Cass Red Coat School opened its doors to BBC's The One Show and helped to organise the filming of a segment for the show.

The segment was based on the 1971 student strikes, whereby students from Sir John Cass Red Coat School went on a strike that made national news.

The segment was presented by punk poet, John Cooper Clarke, and a few ex-students were invited back to school to speak about the strike they participated in. The strike was held to defend the students' English teacher Chris Searle, who was also

invited back to the school forty six years after the Stepney school strike.

As an English teacher, Chris encouraged the students to write poetry about the local area, and produced a book with the students' poetry, Stepney Words, which he published without the school's permission. As a result, Chris was sacked by the school's then governors. The students of the school did not take lightly to one of their favourite teachers being sacked, and organised to go on strike. The strike only lasted for a couple of days, but the force led to Chris being reinstated eight months later.





Poetry is still a thriving discipline at Sir John Cass Red Coat school, and following a trip down memory lane with Chris and the former students, current SJCR pupils were invited to join them and John Cooper Clarke to write a combined poem. By working together to create the poem,

they all established that despite the years that had passed, the community and morals of the Stepney students remains the same. This episode of The One Show was aired on 14th June 2017, and is available to watch on BBC iplayer.

ur Year 12 AS **Business students** enjoyed a great day out visiting the Coca Cola **Education Centre in** Edmonton on Monday 3rd July. Students got the chance to gain first-hand experience of the manufacturing and business world.

With more than 500 nonalcoholic brands, Coca-Cola is one of the largest drink distributors in the world. Not only do they produce

soft drinks, they also have brands in water, sports drinks, energy drinks, juices, coffees and teas. This particular site specialises in producing well-known brands such as Dr Pepper, Sprite, Fanta, Oasis and the famous Coca-

During our factory tour, we were able to see the making of Oasis. We observed the liquid being transferred into bottles. formed into small batches,

and then wrapped in cellophane before being transported into the humongous warehouse which has an automated storage and retrieval system. The warehouse can store up to 23,200 pallets (that's 16 million bottles!) at any one time. Students were also given a presentation about the company allowing them to make connections between the theory covered in classroom and real life business practices.
