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What is Health and Social Care?

Health and social care

Health Care is the treatment, control or prevention of an illness, injury or disability, and the care or aftercare of a person with these needs in hospitals, health centres and in the community.

Social care is the care and support of vulnerable people, usually in the community. This can include assistance with daily living, maintaining independence, social interactions as well as protecting them in vulnerable situations.

You will learn how best to care and support a variety of individuals in a range of different care settings

Course Overview:

- The course is made up of three units:
- **Unit R032: Principles of care in health and social care settings (Y11)**
 - Exam unit (48GLH) - 40% of the course
 - Exam duration: 1 hour and 15 minutes
 - 6 compulsory questions: short and medium answer and extended response
 - 70 marks
 - OCR-set and marked
- **R033: Supporting individuals through life events (Y10)**
 - Coursework unit (36GLH) - 30% of the course
 - Set of two practical assignment tasks
 - 60 marks
 - centre-assessed, OCR moderated
- **R035: Health promotion campaigns (Y10)**
 - Coursework unit (36GLH) - 30% of the course
 - Set of four practical assignment tasks
 - 60 marks
 - centre-assessed, OCR moderated

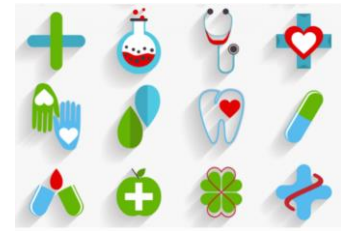
