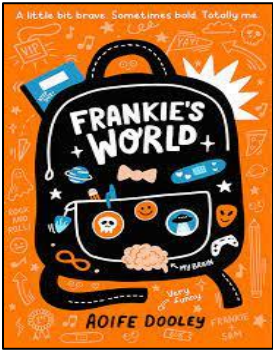

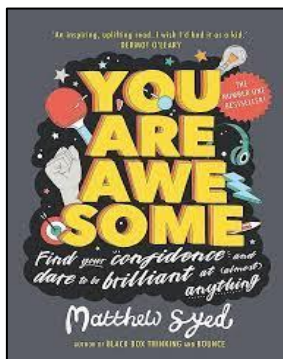
Frankie's World by Aoife Dooley-

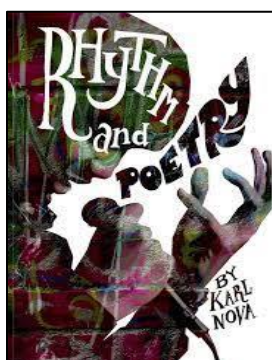
Feel inspired as you read Syed's exciting non-fiction book all about building your own confidence and resilience in the world.

Follow Clara's gripping story as she realises she must finally face what happened last year.

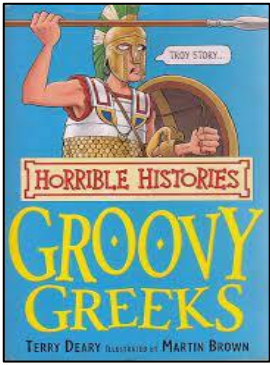


Rhythm and Poetry by Karl Nova -

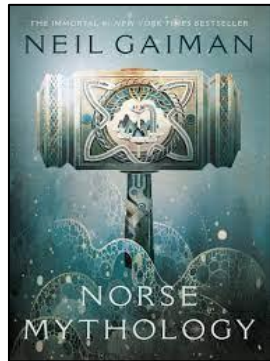

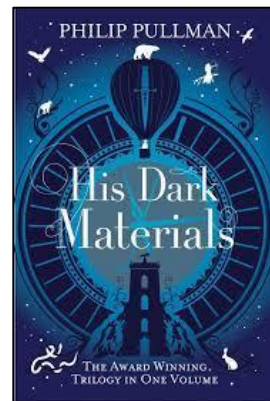
***Horrible Histories: The Groovy Greeks* by Terry Deary and Martin Brown:**

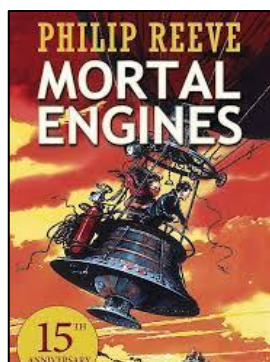
***Norse Mythology* by Neil Gaiman**

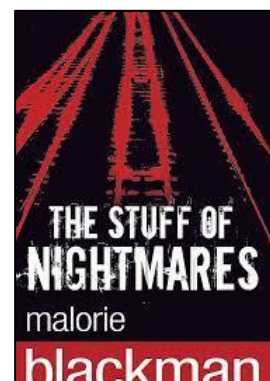
***His Dark Materials* by Philip Pullman**
